Thomas Abel is Professor for Health Research and deputy director at the Institute of Social and Preventive Medicine at the University of Bern, Switzerland (http://www.ispm.ch). A Medical Sociologist with a focus on structure-agency perspectives, his major research program addresses issues of social stratification and inequalities in health and health behaviours.

He has been a visiting Professor at Univ. de Montreal in 2005 (Dép. de médicine sociale et préventive) and at UBC Vancouver in 2012 (Dep. of Sociology).

Thomas Abel has published widely on theoretical and empirical challenges in social science applied in Public Health. As Editor-in-Chief he has led the *International Journal of Public Health* from 2000 until 2011. He has also served as reviewer and consultant for major national and international research institutions and funding agencies.
